

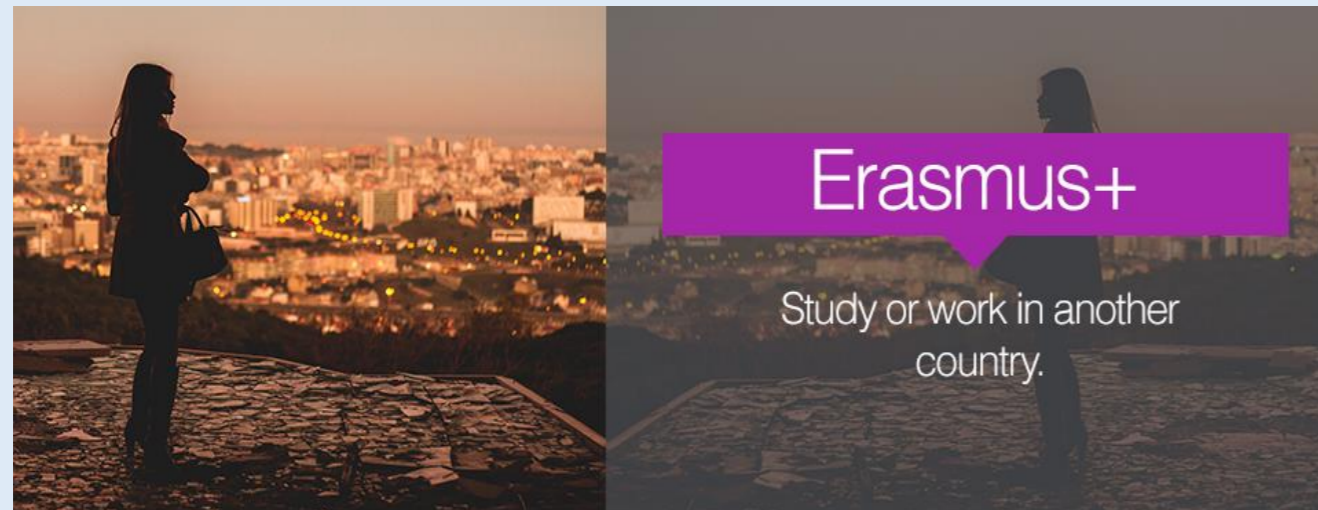
1. ERASMUS+

Erasmus+ work placement is designed to further develop well qualified and motivated students.

The programme is designed especially for bachelor, master and doctoral students regardless of the form of study. Taking the internship can last from 2 months up to one academic year. Students can apply for an Erasmus grant to help to cover the additional expenses of living abroad.
