AFTER ARRIVAL TO PRAGUE

1. REGISTRATION AT THE DORMITORY/FOREIGN POLICE

Before arriving in the Czech Republic, make sure you e-mail / inform your dormitory Manager about your arrival date and time (<u>ubytovani@suz.cvut.cz</u>), so that they have your room and room keys ready.

The dormitory should automatically inform the Foreign Police about your stay there, therefore, you do not have to register yourself at the Foreign Police. However, it is always good to check with the dormitory office in person or email them, just to be sure, if they announced your stay to the foreign police.

If you have arranged your own accommodation outside the dormitories, you are obliged to register with the Foreign Police within three days (72 hours) from your arrival. If you are an EU citizen you can do this within 30 days from your arrival.

2. MY STUDIES

a. Registration to my programme

Registration to your programme (enrolment to your studies) is usually scheduled for the week before the start of the winter semester. Registration takes place in person.

You are obliged to bring the **originals of your documents** (high school/university diploma, transcript of records), **confirmation of completion of nostrification** and **passport with visa**. If you are still waiting for a visa in your passport - bring the confirmation of the application and the expected date of its inssuance. You will sign the 'Health, Safety and Fire Protection' and 'Use of Computers' forms. We will send you the related forms in advance so that you get acquainted with them.

After that, your Study officer will register you for all compulsory courses and then you have to choose which subjects from the groups- Technical courses and Social competences courses you want to be registered for.

You will receive these documents during the registration:

- Confirmation of study
- Study contract that you will sign and then receive back with director's signature

REMEMBER: In your study plan is written how many credits you need to have from each group of subjects. In order to continue your studies, each semester you are obliged to meet the minimum number of required credits. **If you do not meet the minimum required number of credits, you will not be able to continue your studies**. In total, bachelors must have 180 credits at the end of the 6th semester and master's students 120 credits at the end of the 4th semester.

IMPORTANT: Compulsory subjects, even those without credits or exam at the end of the semester, e.g. PE lessons (for more information visit this link: https://www.utvs.cvut.cz/en/) are compulsory to attend, unless the lecturer tells you otherwise during the lectures.

b. My schedule, lectures and attendance

The semester lasts 14 weeks, including one week of semester tests and finalization (submission of semester projects, etc.). After that follow 6 weeks of examination period. Lessons are 90 minutes long, and start at 7:30 a.m. or at 8 a.m. (depending on the faculty). There are 15-minutes breaks between the classes. The last class in the evening starts at 5:45 p.m. or 6:15 p.m.

Lectures vs seminars

There are two types of lessons at CTU. One type are **lectures**, the others are **seminars**. What is the difference?

Lectures are mediated in larger classes, they are more theoretical and attendance is not obligatory.





Seminars are mediated for less students (groups of up to 25/30 students, normally fewer for courses taught in English). They are less theoretical and there are more practical exercises. Attendance is required.

Most courses consist of a weekly lecture and a weekly seminar.

Examination

For most courses you will be asked to deliver some seminar project or write a test during the semester. At the end of each semester you have to pass a test or some other examination (in some cases, the requirement is only to submit the seminar work). First after your seminar work is "approved", you can take the exam. In most cases, your grade is based entirely, or mainly, on the final examination. During the examination period you can take an examination twice or even more times under specific conditions.

Attendance

Remember that you will be registered in full time form of the study programme, therefore the **attendance** is **mandatory**, **unless the lecturers provide you with specific information about the attendance**. If there is a serious reason why you need to leave mid-term or before the end of the teaching period inform your teachers and your study administrator as soon as possible. Check the academic calendar for the exact orientation in holidays, teaching or exam periods.

REMEMBER: You may be assigned any of those dates during the state exam period. You do not choose the date of the state exam, so do not plan a vacation during this period.

c. CTU ID card and systems (KOS, MS Teams, Moodle, UserMap)

CTU ID card

The CTU ID card is your identification card that allows you to enter buildings in the CTU campus. You can use them as a "credit card" in the CTU campus to buy food with student discounts.

To get the CTU card you have to be already registered in your study programme, which is usually in 1-2 days after registration for the study (when your study officer inputs the data to IS KOS). It is necessary to come to the Card Centre of CTU in person, to prove your identity (with ID card / passport / citizen card / driving licence). You will be digitally photographed free of charge in the CTU Card Centre. Take enough cash with you in case of any payments. More information can be found here:

CTU systems (KOS, MS Teams, Moodle, UserMap) KOS

The KOS application is for the academic scheduling and for the administration, web interface of KOS is intended for students. The role of student is automatically assigned to people who are actively enrolled in a bachelor's, continuing master's or doctoral programme of study.

UserMap

UserMap is an application for managing of a selected personal information and main contact directory at CTU. It provides information on the placement of individuals within the CTU organizational structure. It allows user to set the Initial CTU Password, enables user to manage their CTU Password and eduroam Password (The eduroam password is used to access the eduroam world-wide wi-fi network, which provides free access to network devices of participating educational and scientific institutions).

Moodle

System Moodle is e-learning system. You need your CTU user name and password to log in. Teachers upload their presentations or study materials for students at this platform. Sometimes you will be required to submit your essay, seminar work through Moodle. Some courses are accessible in guest mode and you only need to click on the course and you are allowed to enter. However, mainly the courses are closed and only the teacher can make them available to you by sending or telling (during the first lecture) you the entry password.

MS Teams

To log in, please do not use the CTU e-mail address, but the login data for the CTU account in the format: **username@cvut.cz** and the CTU password. A team is a central place for work, activity and collaboration. However, you have a quick overview of what is happening. You can create messages and virtually meet not only your classmates, but as well share files, screens and complete tasks and assignments.

3. CZECH BANK ACCOUNT

It is convenient for the students to open a local bank account in the Czech Republic. However, to open a student account, you will have to provide:

- your passport and/ or other ID (some banks can request two documents with photos),
- a proof of being a student in the Czech Republic (we will provide you with a confirmation of your studies on the day of your registration to the programme.)
- the minimum initial deposit.

CTU scholarships are sent only to the Czech bank accounts.

All major bank companies (Komerční banka, Česká spořitelna, UniCredit Bank, Raiffeisenbank, Fio bank, MONETA Money Bank) are located close to Dejvická metro station.



On the -1st floor (take a turn right from the reception desk and go down the stairs, open the green door, take a turn right and you will see orange glass door) is small bistro where you can buy drinks (hot/cold) or food (snacks or lunch such as sandwich/panini/other hot meals or soup).

5. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public transport in Prague is very easy to use. You can travel by tram, bus or metro. Prague metro has three lines (**A-green**, **B-yellow**, **C- red**). You will use most of the time the line **A**.







Public transport tickets can be purchased directly at the office at the airport or at the machines at the bus stop at the airport or directly at the machines on the bus (this option is only available for payments by credit card).

You can buy a single ticket for each trip, 30 CZK (valid for 30 minutes) or 40 CZK (valid for 90 minutes) or you can have a long-term ticket, once you are registered in your study programme.

Indeed, after registration, you will receive the confirmation of study. Please bring it to one of the public transport offices to get the public transport card called "**Lítačka**". You can buy as well a coupon for 1 month, 3 months or 12 months for students. Please visit the website below for more information:

6. MOBILE PHONE CONNECTION (OPERATORS)

The Czech Republic has several mobile operators, the major ones are O2, T-Mobile and Vodafone. They all offer student tariffs, so when you're enrolled in your study programme you will receive a study confirmation to prove that you are a student. Prices are between 500-1000 CZK per a month.

7. MEDICAL INSURANCE AND HOSPITALS

Health care is provided by both state and private medical facilities.

International students in the Czech Republic are required to hold proof of medical insurance coverage upon entrance into the Czech Republic. The type of insurance that international students are required to have follow varies depending on their length of stay and their country of origin.

Students from the EU should also request their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Such cards are issued by the national health provider in your country. Please find more information on these websites:

8. WORK

Yes, you can work while studying, but keep in mind that you have applied and will be registered in full time form of study, therefore your main priority is school and your obligations towards it.

International students may have difficulty finding work due to the language barrier, however, international companies are mostly located in large cities. Your nationality also plays a role, citizens of EU/EEA countries and Switzerland do not need a work permit. Students from Non-EU/EEA countries (citizens of third countries) do not need a work permit if they are studying a degree programme in a present (fulltime) form, and the degree programme is accredited by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport.

However, we strongly recommend you to visit websites of Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs of the Czech Republic (https://www.mpsv.cz/en/) and check the conditions applicable to your country.

If you find a job during your studies, you can try to contact us and our guarantor for internships for foreign students, and based on the content of the work, have it recognized as an Internship subject and get the necessary credits for it - 18 ECTS (BSc) and 6 ECTS (MSc).

Prague, the capital of Czech Republic, is situated In Bohemia on the Vltava river. It has about one million inhabitants. Main touristic places of the city:


- Old town square
